

**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

Last week, His Eminence, Cardinal Egan, celebrated a Bicentennial Mass for Dutchess County at St. Mary's in Wappingers Falls. A limited number of people were invited to represent each of the parishes in Dutchess County, so members of our Parish Council and staff attended. At the end of the Mass the Cardinal spoke about the vibrancy and growth of the Catholic Church in Dutchess County and, of course, mentioned the building of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha Church. He also mentioned that he was recently appointed to the Vatican Committee responsible for recommending individuals for sainthood. He promised that he would do everything possible to promote the cause of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. I would also ask you to pray that Blessed Kateri be canonized a saint. There are prayer cards at the back of the church for this purpose. Please take one.

Most of you have noticed the cross placed on top of the new church. This is the wooden cross built for the groundbreaking ceremony, and the workmen asked if they could place it on the roof. This cross is a powerful symbol and gives us a sense of the size of our new church. The cross makes this structure a holy place and reminds us of our call to be a holy people.

Many of you have asked when we will be able to place our family stones under the place where our altar will be placed. I have not been given a date by the builders, but it will be in the next few weeks. Be ready, but don't make them too large. They have to fit down a four inch pipe.

As you can see, much progress is being made on the roof and side walls of the new building. All the steel framing is up, and the next dramatic step will be starting the exterior stone work. The builders are hopeful they will start in the next couple of weeks. We are just now selecting the interior tile and colors. When some of these items are selected, I hope to have a parish presentation to show some of these items to you.

Finally, and most importantly, we are moving into November; a month when we remember, in a special way, all those who have gone before us -- our deceased relatives and friends. On November 1<sup>st</sup>, the Feast of All Saints, we celebrate all those united with Christ and praying for us. On this day we will celebrate three Masses at 9am, 5pm and 7pm. November 2<sup>nd</sup> is All Souls Day, a special day of prayer for all those who have died. While not a Holy Day of Obligation, it is traditionally a day when many attend Mass to pray for deceased relative and friends. The Masses on All Souls Day are 9am and 7pm. You may also pray for your deceased relatives and friends by using the All Souls Day Envelopes and placing the names of those you want remembered on the spaces provided. They will be placed next to the tabernacle for the month of November.
